

District Training Officer

Nature of Work

The Fire District's Training Officer shall be responsible for organization and implementation of a training program for the WRJFD. The program shall take into consideration all service delivery areas of the District, including, but not limited to, fire suppression, rescue, haz-mat, EMS, and fire prevention, inspections and investigation. The Training Officer shall be able to develop individual lesson plans for specific topics, including the use of learning objectives, instructional aids, and evaluation instruments. The Training Officer shall maintain adequate records and reports for the District evidencing the training and level of skill of its firefighters, officers, and other employees. The Training Officer shall also be responsible for the training budget of the District, and shall coordinate the use of training funds with the District's Fire Chief and Clerk.

Minimum Qualifications

The Training Officer should have five years of firefighting experience.

He should have knowledge of, and ability to comply with, NFPA 1041, "Standard for Fire Service Instructor Professional Guidelines", Instruction II (Chapter 3).

The Training Officer should have knowledge of the WRJFD's operational policies and general principles of firefighting, rescue, haz-mat, incident command, EMS, and fire prevention, inspection, and investigation.

He should have state certification for Fire Instruction, or the willingness to become state certified.

He should have the ability to work with the District's chief officers, company officers, firefighters, and other employees.
